COVID-19 Health Disparities Federal Funding Unspent

States Have Yet to Spend Hundreds of Millions of Federal Dollars to Tackle COVID Health Disparities

Biden's administration invested \$2.25 billion specifically to help U.S. states target COVID-19 health disparities in early 2021. The COVID-19 pandemic demonstrated the need for targeted funding for disparities, as racial and ethnic minorities faced the brunt of COVID-19 with the highest rates of hospitalizations and deaths due to the virus.

While this is beneficial to vulnerable minorities, states have only used small portions of their funding. Illinois Department of Public Health received \$28.9 million, but has only managed to spend \$138,000. Many other states have spent less than 20% of their funding. This lack of use of funding has been used by Republicans against Democrats to oppose increased pandemic funding.

Public health departments cite various reasons for not using their funding, such as: state's long budget process, needing more staff, needing time to develop relationships with non-profits to set up programs. Some also claim to already be using other federal dollars to resolve COVID-19 disparities.

However, this lack of spending of their allocated funding, emphasizes the years of neglect of state public health departments, as they were not prepared to received such large funding. For years, public health systems have been understaffed and over-burdened. These public health systems lack the infrastructure to be able to use their funding, a result of governmental neglect.

MAHA's Asian Health Equity Alliance was recently created in May 2021 with CDC funding to work on developing programs targeting health disparities and working towards health equity and justice. Specifically, AHEA is working on increasing COVID-19 vaccination rates among minorities in areas with low vaccination rates through coalition-building, community outreach, and culturally-sensitive education.

Summer Youth Program

MAHA's summer youth program for participants ages 11 - 16 is a 6 week program where youth will learn new skills from arts and craftmanship. We also provide various workshops relating to mental health, substance



use prevention, oral hygiene, civic engagement, money management and provide community services opportunities for youth participants. Registration is currently closed, but keep an eye for future youth programs!

Effective July 1, changes to **Health Benefits for Immigrant Adults** (HBIA) and **Health Benefits for Immigrant Seniors** (HBIS) are expanding eligibility.

Any immigrant in Illinois ages 42+ who are ineligible for Medicaid due to immigration status can apply for coverage under the HBIA & HBIS programs. Qualified applicants must meet the following conditions:

- not a U.S. Citizen
- non-citizen status that does not meet the criteria for Medicaid
- · resident of the State of Illinois
- income is at or below 138% FPL (\$18,754 individual income)
