Poverty and uninsured rates drop thanks to pandemic policies

Along with poorer health outcomes, the U.S. has one of the highest rates of people without health insurance in the world. However, improvements were made during the COVID-19 pandemic.

According to the United States Census Bureau, childhood poverty and general poverty experienced decreases during the COVID-19 pandemic. Childhood poverty decreased from 9.7% to 5.2% in 2021. Overall poverty rate decreased from 9.2% to just under 8%. Experts believe that these accomplishments are a result pandemic measures related to the child tax credit (expanded in the 2021 American Rescue Plan) and Medicaid.

This extra income allowed families to spend on essentials and in some cases, extracurriculars

However, once this public health emergency is declared over, the COVID relief bill will also end. This could mean that over 15 million people will lose Medicaid for a variety of reasons. These positive changes in poverty and insurance rates demonstrate the power and impact policies can have on people's well-being. However, it is up to our government to make these policies permanent or at least modify them so they continue to help people living in poverty and lacking health insurance.

Unfortunately, Biden administration's efforts to permanently expand the child tax credit failed to gain approval from Republican Senators. Therefore, while it is heartening to see positive change, push back against these policies might erase the progress made during the pandemic.



Learn about our programs: Region 8 Immunization



MAHA received funding from IDPH to implement a Covid-19 immunization, education and outreach program at its suburban office located (4360 E New York Street, Room #105, Aurora, IL 60504). The goal of the program is to address the specific and unique Covid-19 vaccination needs among the population disproportionately affected in the focused areas of Region 8, especially youths and parents, and to

increase access to COVID-19 vaccinations through education and outreach. Region 8 makes up parts of the west central suburban area (Aurora, Naperville, Elgin, Addison, and Bensenville). The program recently completed a community assessment survey which will be used to develop a strategic plan to guide the program implementation. The program has begun hosting vaccine clinics in the areas and is currently looking for additional opportunities to host educational events and additional vaccine clinics.
