


Things You Need to Know About Fentanyl

fentanyl is a synthetic opioid made in a lab that is 50 to 100 times more powerful than morphine. It is mixed with other illicit drugs to increase potency of the drug. Can come in forms of powders, nasal spray, and pressed pills to look like regular prescription medication (i.e., Xanax).


Signs of an Overdose

- Unconscious
- Very small pupils
- Slow or shallow breathing
- Vomiting

- Inability to speak
- Faint heartbeat
- Purple lips & finger nails
- Pale skin

What should you do if you suspect a fentanyl overdose?

- 1. Call 911 immediately.
- 2. If you have <u>Narcan</u> or Naloxone, administer it to the person as you wait for help or the ambulance
- 3. Try to keep the person awake and breathing
- 4. Turn the person on their side to prevent choking.
- 5. Stay with the person until paramedics arrive.



What is Narcan?

or Naloxone can is a medication approved by the FDA. It reverses an overdose by blocking the effects of fentanyl and other opioids, such as heroin, morphine, and oxycodone.
